

TULE SPRINGS

Tule Springs, 13 miles northwest of Las Vegas, on the main traveled wagon road to the Bullfrog mining district, and at one time quite an important point to freighters and travelers, is at present in a deserted condition. There is not a single person residing there now. There are evidences on all sides of the springs of there having been lively times there at one time, and that an eating house, booze joint and other institutions did good business, but with the passing of the railroad came a slow and gradual death, and the coyotes and rabbits roam at will and ease among the ruins of the little tent town.

Surrounding the springs, which seem to have a plentiful supply of good water, there are a number of acres of land of a rich loamy character, susceptible of producing fruits and vegetables to perfection, and some day some intelligent tiller of the soil will establish a home there and become the possessor of one of the best paying properties in the State of Nevada.
